Pupil Support Fund

Thank you very much for offering to help to help a young child to go to school.

The Pupil Support Fund runs alongside the normal fundraising activities for The Uphill Trust. Funds donated for pupil support are ring-fenced for this purpose. Any money that remains unused at the end of each academic year not (e.g. due to favourable exchange rates) is held in the fund to cover emergency medical treatment or to help with unanticipated costs that may arise for any of the supported children.

	DONATION LEVEL	Year	Month	All supported pupils receive the following items along with payment of school/examination fees and lunch each day
1	Help a child attend school on a day pupil basis	£120	£10	Uniform, shoes, school bag, casual clothes, school supplies (as needed) PLUS
2	Help a child who lives too far away to walk to school on a daily basis to attend school and to stay locally during term time	£240	£20	Washing kit, personal hygiene supplies, bedding pack & medicines (as needed)
3	The fund also accepts one-off donations of any amount	-	-	One-off donations are used to help any child who has short term support needs

Uphill Junior School provides 3 years of kindergarten and 7 years of primary level education.

Each child receives a good grounding in the basics of literacy and numeracy plus other curriculum subjects before being promoted to a higher year group. The school teaches subjects according to Ugandan National Curriculum and the children are assessed by sitting national examinations each school year.

In November 2017 children in this rural community had the opportunity to sit the Ugandan **Primary Leaving Examination** for the very first time - without this qualification they are not able to progress onto secondary education. This is a huge accomplishment for the staff of Uphill Junior School and the parents are very happy that this opportunity is now available for their children. So are we!

Very few children in rural areas go onto secondary school, although some do attend a local vocational institute. The Pupil Support Fund is for children attending Uphill Junior School only - when a supported child reaches P7 and leaves the school, support funding passes to a younger Uphill pupil.
